New Autopsy Policies

- Shared autopsy defined as two residents (+fellow)
- No limit on number of shared autopsies
- No limit on number of forensic autopsies
- Complete autopsy—chest, abdomen, pelvis (brain)
- Maximum single organ autopsies=5; cannot be shared
- Maximum limited autopsies=10; can be shared
- Limited—chest only, abdomen only
- Effective 2018
- New fetopsy policy

ABP Actions-Clinical Informatics

- ACGME requires 2 years training
- Concerns about length of training
- ABP approved two years concurrent training in CI combined with another 12 month subspecialty fellowship, completed in two years
- Acceptable to ACGME
- Fellows will qualify for certification in CI and another ABP subspecialty
- Extended "by experience" pathway until 2022
